ケンブリッジ大学歴史学部卒業後、1994年に初来日。サセックス大学大学院修士課程・博士課程修了。2004年以降、北海道大学に勤めている。専門分野は、メディア・文化学。



I have spent over 20 years living, studying and working in Japan. During that time my job or position has always been related to “internationalization”. I started as an Assistant English Teacher (AET) on the JET Programme. I have been a “gaikokujin kyoshi” and a “kokuhi ryugakusei”. Now, I am the convenor of Hokkaido University’s Modern Japanese Studies Program, which is a pillar of Hokkaido University’s internationalization efforts along with Nitobe College. But what does “internationalization” mean, and why is it necessary? Has “international” become out of date in the “global” era? How do non-Japanese people build careers in Japan? Using examples drawn from my own experiences, I will consider what it means to be an “international” person. I will also introduce what we are trying to do on the Modern Japanese Studies Program as a highly international degree program with a strong focus on one country: Japan.
